

Sir Ronald Ross 1857-1932 British MD & Bacteriologist

born at Almora, India 13 May 1857

after M.D. in London entered Indian medical service in 1881

Began study of Malaria in 1892. Verified in 1895 that microorganism of disease spread by mosquitoes and in 1897-98 investigated the life history of the parasites.

Received nobel prize in 1902 for medicine.
