

Acts 27 & 28 Journey To Rome: most detailed account known of an ancient voyage ← orig. name became official title of the emperor.

27:1. Julius a centurion of Augustus' Band (A cohort or ~ 300 to 600 men)
Cohort = $\frac{1}{10}$ th Roman Legion,

Augustus (Caesar also a title) Augustus 31 BC, Claudius AD 41, } Ascensions
Tiberius AD 14, Caligula AD 37, Claudius AD 41, Nero AD 54 } of Roman
Emperors
Josephus says 5 cohorts stationed at Caesarea.

2. Adramyctium (seaport of Mysia) near Aesop & Troas

Aristarchus native of Thessalonica & devoted fellow-laborer of Paul ^{first mentioned} Ac 19
with Timothy
Demetrius Ephesian

3. Sidon (seaport revival of Tyre which is 20 m. south)

4. Under Cyprus (under the lee of Cyprus - to avoid W. winds)

5. Myra important in corn trade Egypt → Rome

6. Ship of Alexandria Rome almost entirely dependent on Egypt for corn (wheat) ^{cereal grain}
ships unloaded at Puteoli or Ostia. Great rejoicing in Italy on arrival of corn ships

7. End Cradice a port, Salmon on Crete

8. Fair Havens (^{near} Lasea) on Crete south side

← still known by this name today.

9. much time spent sailing dangerous Sept 14 - Nov 11 (over)

9 Cont'd - nov 11 - mar 5th navigation suspended.

The fact (day of atonement) about the autumnal equinox (Sept 21)
days night of equal length) sun crosses equator.
only fact ordered by the law - scape goat - bullock + goat sacrificed.

10 & 11 no comment

12. Phenice (Phoenix) a better port; i.e., more protection.

16. Running under clauda - (in lee of clauda) come by the boat ← secure the boat.

40. Rudder Bands - (Two rudders) held out of sea by bands
St Paul's Bay
