Snith, and William Holmes Walker climbed Lion's Head mountain overlooking Capetown and dedicated South Opica to the preaching of the Restred Gospel of Jesus Christ. These three missionaries had been called to serve by Brigham young at a special conference of the elders of the church held in the old Salt Lake city Jahrmacle in 1852. It is Interestingly, at that same conference 57 elders were called to serve in Europe, # to asia, and 14 to serve in asia.

on Sept. 15; 1852, the 3 fourth Ofrican Eders, Haven, Sunth, and Walter said forewell to their families and travelled by wagon to new york city together with another 103 missionaries called to serve in various parts of the world. They travelled without purse or script and arrived at cape Jown via England on april 18, 1853 seven months after leaving Salt Lake City.

as they commenced their proselytizing efforts, they met immediate opposition from the local clergy and press but succeeded in haptizing 45 people within the next six months. Before they left in 1855, 174 people had been haptized.

we do not we are not that successful today. There are currently a total of about 120 missionaries in South africa and in Zimbabwe. The yearly harvest is about 440 converts, which amounts to Comparing, by calculation, the so our present day efforts to those of Haven, Smith, and Walker, they were 8 times more effective.

Most of the converts coming into the church in africa today are non-whites, It is difficult to convert whites

in South africa and zumbabwe. I made a comment concerning this in my Journal on april 1, 1983. That way be of interest.

"Our mission zone held a brain (barbeau) today at brother Mohole home, high on the mountainede at St., farmes overlooking Kalk Bay.

The view was, well, fantastic! You could see Cape Point, False Bay, distant mountains [the Brackenbergs], the sandy and [the] rockey beaches, the surf, wind surfers, swimmers, [sum bothers], [housey, clouds, and distant horizons - also, other lovely homes, stacked on the hillsides. - I know why the mission arise work is so slow here. The people whealy think they are in heaven, and they are physically, the Cape is a Garden of Eden ---.

There are four main groups of people in South africa; (Indians)

(1) the whites (usually called Europeans) 1770, (2) The arians, 470,

(3) The Bantus (native blacks) 78, and (4) the Coloureds (ranging from nearly white to nearly black 970. The total population is about 30,000,000 people.

It was our priviledge to spend 5 months, tracting and teaching among the cood coloureds - often called cape coloureds because most of them live in the Cape Province, our assigned area was mitchells Plain, a relatively new city of nearly, 200, 000 people. It is located about 37 km (23 miles) furtheast of the center of Capetown and about 27 km (16 miles) from our berengeti apartment in Mowbray. He mitchells Plain has many miles of sandy beach fronting & False Bay with nice recreational facilities. The city is well planned, It has 6 lane divided access roads, 6 lane main city roads, and 4 and 2 lane lesser roads. All roads have sidewalks on

both sides of the street. All streets are lighted. Electrical power is underground. Most houses are 3 bedrooms with a kitchen, dining room and living room. They have flush toilets, and hot and cold running water refrigerators and electric stoves, while the lots are small, there is room to park a car, have a small lawn and flowers in the point and a garden in back, They are heavily subsidized by the over government and sell for around \$12,000. They have nice schools, shopping walls, theatres, and recreational facilities and In addition to the fine road system for motor vehicles there is fast electric train and bus service to the area.

I The Hoyles later converted Edmund and Irene Brown, and who have three shildrens ( natalie, Bernard, and Carmon). to the church. We took over from the Hoyles the first week last week in December +982, around the first of January 1983. We continued the work there along with 2 young elders until the middle of May of 1983. Niether the young Elders nor Sister Hall and I saw any coloureds come into the church. President D. Phillip Margetts, upon our leaving for home did not intend to replace us and the two young Elders were seeking a transfer and recommending that M.P. be closed down. I well, we're sorry to not have had any baptisms. We to hope that we've planted some seeds that someday will bear fruit among the M.P. Colowreds. It was easy to Tracting is easy in M.P. we spent most of our time in M.P. tracting in the area known as New portlands, Referrals took us to homes in most of the M.P. areas so that we were familiar with the entire city. Everyone who lives on Cambridge St. now knows something

about the church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Laints. Day after day we were there distributing tracts, Book of Mormons, and giving discussions, showing film strips, and praying with families. The Halls and there yellow Toyota were as familiar a sight on Cambridge # St. as the Sce Cream wan, The children followed us around as though we were the pied pipers of Harring. We came to love the people on Combridge St. and many came to love us. They would follow us from house to house to see the film strips Mormon in the cape; most of them in M. P. (Incidentally we gave placed)

Here are many sound parts is the Book of 3 repli (especially chapt 17) which records the visit of Jesus Christ, after His resourcection, to His people in ancient america We know that thes book is true, and that you too, can know

hopes were always shattered this way.

We were the prime beneficiaries of our mission. For the first time in our lives we shared each other 24 hours a day consecutive for 578 days. Our love increased. So did our testimonies. I saw no heatenly beings, but sheard my name, just as swely as Joseph Swith heard his in the Sacred Grove, and received affirmation that I was doing the right thing in the right place at the right time and that the church was true.
