DEAR FAMILY,

I have my first good Ecuatorian story for you!  
Weren't you excited -- thought you would be --

Tonight our zone leader was supposed to have baptisms in the church - not our chapel (where the Fermis -- we are) but the chapel where they are working -- and seeing as we had an investigator who needed an interview -- we decided to go to the chapel of the ZL's, let our investigator see the baptismal service and afterwards he could receive his interview.

Well - we left in a taxi at about 7:30 - they dropped us off near the chapel and we walked a couple of blocks to the chapel - during this time our investigator, Antonio (23 yrs. old) was saying that this was a very dangerous area and I should take my watch off and he was saying he was a bit scared because he had on nice sneakers. I was thinking to myself that he should chill out and not be so uptight.

Anyway, we arrived at the chapel and it was all locked up, the elders hadn't arrived yet. Right after we arrived to the locked up chapel, our attention was called to something occurring w/in the same block as us - just a couple houses down from the church -
