We had to ask that Hannah be removed from her history class. She was having a really bad experience with a teacher. (He is a new teacher, just came in at the semester break. He kept seeking Hannah's counsel because he was having a terrible time with the class. He would pull her aside during class for personal conferences. She began to feel uncomfortable—to the point that she didn't want to go to his class.) She tried really hard to work things out but it finally reached a point where we could see we had to step in. I've been talking to the administrator off and on for the past two months. Finally, I could see that the only way to move forward on this problem was to tell the school that we would not permit her to attend the class any more. We finalized things yesterday and the school allowed her to move to a different teacher.

Following that I had to talk to Hyrum's computer tech teacher. He is failing the class. Forty percent of the grade is based on speed. He can only type 17 words a minute so he is getting an F for 40% of his grade. Even if he had 100% in the other areas he would get a D in the class. Because he is a slow typist he has a hard time completing assignments—so he has a C or D grade in the other 60%. He can't bring the assignments home because the shcool uses Apples and we have an IBM. I was really mad at the teacher!! Of course I had just finished dealing with the high school vice principal and then to have a junior high teacher tell me that my child was going to fail a class because he didn't have good finger dexterity just pushed my all my buttons!!
