Henry C got a Ford truck in 1912.
Then got a model T Ford & extended
frame on it & put a frame with
wheels on it and then sprockets
on these wheels and a chain from the
sprockets on rear end of truck and
thru to these - chain drive you know -
made a ten truck out of it, you
know. Body frame extended &
on this frame 2 wheels, 2 wheels
with large sprockets on them &
small sprockets on axle of the Ford
and that gave it lots of power. That
truck went all over Eastern Wyo. &
Bingham Canyon hauling furniture
mostly. They protected the furniture
with Tarps. Then he got a 2 Ton
truck & a truck with a continental
engine - a van you know - moved
furniture to Beantills & Evanson &
all around.
