That G.I. bill was a smart idea because
thousands of Navy & Army men went
back to school on it & took act degrees.

The income tax they later paid as professionals prob more than
after he graduated. with his Ph.D in 1948 he took
to Schenectady N.Y. in a car we had
purchased brought from his brother Eugene.

The car had no upholstery & leaned
to one side, but it took us safely East -
we used it until we could buy a new one.

We were at S.E. ^{from 1948 to 1955} where Tracy
became ~~of~~ somewhat famous at

In 1955 we came to Utah where Tracy
had accepted as a Director of research at Y
