The W.S. Bureau of mines Salt Lake Station my life long friend Frank Davis left sperry Flour Wills in about 1942 and altered a technical position at the Bureau. By now had had started on my masters degree at the surversity of setals & graduated after graduating from the last high school class at agalen High school I enrolled at water Junior college also in ogden. a number of my friends including Lave competers Saviele Reeder, Vern Stromberg, and some forgotton ones also enrolled. we all took technical courses including chemistry, higher math, geology, and surveying. on graduating from weber I got a room in a house up on the avenues. I cooked on a hot plate. Later, so Jack Barrett joined me, The room cost each of us five dollars a week, I was now seeing Ida-Rose on almost a weekly basis. I would take the street can to the end of the line at Hot Springs and hich a ride to orden. It was safe in those days.

I would reverse the procedure on returning to Sake City. Our family was now living in a house on the south side of 26th street between adams and Jefferson Brennes. There were two blue sprice trees in the front of the house and you had to go plan steps to get to the Our love was getting pretty serious for both of us at this sound. I was working at Sperry flowr mile at this time (I node a bicycle about one mile to get there). I would get to sur 25th street home about 5 pen and Ida-Rose, who worked at the heart country would leave work a little later. I would now be sitting on the ledge of the porch and Idar Rose would after stop by on her way home which was actually out of her way I need to back track a little to tell you of a struggle that I had to stay in school at the N. of U. On registration day I was alone. none of my friends were there. The registration lines were long and the procedures I had to go through intimedated me. Its hard to tell you how alone I felt - Forter and I came within a gnosts ear of forgetting about more college additional college works education

I think I have previously discussed some of my experiences at checketts Photo so a lot of money al wort repeat that, But maybe I will, Denton for a Checketts owed me twenty bollars when I left for school at the university of retal and I was never able to collect it from him. Ida-Rose and I married on September 24th 1941 which. Her mother, charlotte was also warned our September 24th. after a brief hovegroon at a motel near Wasatch Hot springe and some time at the state Fair we moved into a \$15/ month, share the kitchen and bath, Summer and winter we slept on this open air screened in purch. We had a good time there with the other collège occupants. We had arrived in Salt Lake City with \$300.00 cash that I had saved to start our marriage.

How we came to Purchase the Farm Both Ida Rose and I spent their early life on a farm in both instances so after being somewhat settled eve thought we night to buy some sandy took land in the mapleton area where we expected the soil to be sandy loan. well, we never found anything to our liking so we abandoned the idea. We had learned that former ogden friends had moved to Payson retah and were operating a small daving. The friends were noble DeHart who lived in Ida-Rose's ninth ward and ardell Bussell who to had also lived for a few years in that ward but mainly lived in eny Ogden 18th ward so we went to visit them. Some The I 15 Thomas ay had not been We talked to them about land and said that the 38 acres accrose the street north was for sale. a messy divorce caused this land to be put up for sale. We tried to buy half of the piece but would not sell so we bought the entire piece for \$ 27,500.00. other farmers thought that we had paid to much and that the land was only worth \$7600.00 which assumed to only \$200,00 per acre. Time would tell, however that the pur chase was propitions. Later on the State of Utah DOT took 8 acres of owe land to establish the twen offs and paid us \$ 32,000.00 for this land.

How I met Ida-Rose Langford Lane Compton and I were I was walking south on the east sidewalk of washington avenue In Ogden with wear just south of 25th Street. I noticed this girl that I had seen before at ninth ward dances. I said to Lane, " I've seen that girl before but I don't pet a date with her." Somehow, I asked around, got her telephone number and asked the for a date. She said she abready had a date So I called later and asked her to go with me to the new years eve dance yoursered by the Church (1939) in the white City Ballroom fon the north side of 24th Street between washington and adams avenues.
