

He says some of his patients have had it for 3 months. (It's been a month for Tracy.) He says that it might help and it couldn't hurt, at least.

Lat about 9:30 Tracy had Dr. Wallace's nurse give him a shot of gamma. He came home & ate breakfast and as he was finishing his breakfast ~~it~~ <sup>he</sup> suddenly became dizzy and faint. Laying down did not alleviate this so after about 20 min we called Dr. Wallace. His nurse suggested trauma to the shot, but that usually happens immediately after the shot.

after a couple of hours Tracy still felt really terrible - dizzy & faint & sick. Dr. Wallace was out of town and so I tried to call Dr. Garner & Dr. Numer took the call as he was "on call". He would not take the case as he did not want to assume responsibility.

Dr. Wallace's nurse had ~~told~~ me to take Tracy to the emergency room but he was ~~chilling~~ & I hated to take him down there where he might chill even further. Dr. Numer thought he should go there, too.

I went into the study & prayed that if I should take Tracy down to the hospital I would

receive a feeling of real apprehension - even greater than I already had. But that the decision would come to Tracy who had the priesthood. A feeling of calm came over me and when Tracy came out of the bathroom he said "It's so all over going down to the hospital."

Meanwhile Phyllis — and Dr. Wallace's nurse had gone up to Dr. Calin & he came down. He called Tracy.

His diagnosis was that the shot had been given to Tracy to a vein and entered the bloodstream too rapidly and ~~to~~ as a result the body was reacting to a "foreign" protein. He says the feeling would pass.

Sunday today, the feeling did not "pass." Tracy I wake at 4:30 & Tracy was all-  
ready awake. His symptoms, besides weakness & dizziness are a great thirst. We're kind of waiting now to call the Dr. at a reasonable hour. I am very worried. He is so ill. About noon Tracy was feeling not quite so ill so he thought he would wait and see if the gamma would help him.

Monday. He had a very bad night and this morning Dr. Wallace sent him into the Hospital lab to give a specimen for a series of blood tests.
