Beloved long-time ward member Ida Rose Hall passed away peacefully Monday evening, March 7, 2005. She was born February 20, 1921 in Burch Creek, Utah. Ida Rose was the fourth of seven children born to Ernest and Zina Charlotte Chlarson Langford.

Growing up in Ogden, she attended Weber State, where she dated Howard Tracy Hall. They were married September 24, 1941 in the Salt Lake temple.

Ida Rose put her education on hold to start a family and focus on Tracy's undergraduate work and wartime naval service. At war's end, she used her considerable sewing skills in support of their three children and Tracy's pursuit of his Ph.D. at the University of Utah. A career in research at General Electric took them to Schenectady, New York. Three more children blessed them while there.

In 1955 Tracy was wooed away from GE with a promise of less money, to become Director of Research at BYU. After moving into the present home, their seventh child was born.

Her dawn to dusk days were filled with family prayer, scripture reading, meals, music lessons, sewing most every clothing need, letters to her five missionaries, and seeing all sever children through the temple.

In her spare time, she grew orchids and began her long deferred college career. Nearly all of her classes were geared toward blessing her kindred dead. She and Tracy traveled to Sweden to use those skills in family research.

In 1982-83 Ida Rose and Tracy served a mission to Zimbabwe then South Africa. The restored gospel and selfreliance were taught with equal fervor.

Ida Rose's decades of dedicated church service turned to a valiant 30-month struggle with cancer.
