Chlarson, brother of Hyrum and, also, of my Grandmother Zina Charlotte Chlarson Langford. P.S. Mom told me Louis forgot to tell that his father, Heber Otto, was a "fiddler." He played violin at all those dances Louis talked about. Mom said Heber Otto had a restless spirit and never could stay in one place. She said if he had stayed in one place long enough, Ida Isabelle had enough drive to support the family herself, but he never let her get settled long enough to get going. He finally did settle most permanently in Mesa, Arizona. Both he and Ida Isabelle died in the little yellow-brick building Grandma and Grandpa Langford had on their property at 3292 Orchard Avenue in Ogden, as Grandma Langford took care of them in their infirmity.
