I have three bell christmas ornaments which just fit the crocheted bells. I have been blocking them three at a time and then drying them over the register. I use one part of Elmer's glue and two parts of water to block them with instead of startch and this way, when they are stored they do not mildew and do not attract bugs.

I have a million questions to ask youabout the branch, etc. How is the work in the church going? How are you doing in your new calling as Pres. of the R.S.? I have been swamped. Our ward, here, is getting older. The people, that is, and some are developing terminal diseases. Since Sept. when I became President, we have had two funerals, and two people in our ward have terminal cancer. Also one of our neighbors (non Mormon, but still lovely people, is in the hospital. He is 90 and It will be a minor miracle if he survives. We might have another funeral before we have Christmas.

Many of the crocheted ornaments you sent me I will use on my tree this year, but I also sent 24 of each to a woman who has a shop in a ski resort area who handles some of the crocheted goods I sent home from Zimbabwe when we were there. I just sent it today. I only sent 18 of the bells, as that was all I had blocked. I hope they sell. Where this particular ski resort is they have not started their season as it is farther south and there is no snow as yet. However, this week, we expect a storm which should extend down there. Once the skiers come they should start selling, so I hope the skiers come before Christmas. Christmas ornaments do not sell well after Christmas. It is too close to christmas for me to do anything to try to sell them other places, besides I am too busy right now. However, I now have samples to show and maybe after the first of the year, I can get some orders or find some prospective customers for next year.

I went to Barclays Bank to ask them how to best send money to you when I need to. They said that the Cashiers check was still the best and cheapest way. Even opening an account would not help.

Did Peter marry Esther? If not, what is the trouble. Is sister Chaya still coming to church. I understood that Brother Chaya had gone inactive. How about the other children? Chaya children I mean, are they still active in the church. Is Charles Mutize still coming, and his wife? And have they sent missionary couples to work with the branch, or are you still on your own. How is Peter doing as a branch President. Oh, how I wish I could visit you again. We think so often of you. Keep active in the church. It is the true church of God, and the way to personal salvation in his Kingdom. If I don't see you in this world again, I know I will see you there and embrace you again.


