I will send then slow boat or the cost to you will be so high you won't make much money on the guilts. I presume you can get batting in South Africa. If not, I can send you batting from here. The batting which I sent you for Christmas is not my favorite batting! The regular bonded is better. I think I mentioned to you in my other letter that I could send a bat which will cut into 6 36x45 quilts and which will cost approximately 12. including shipping. I think I shall send you one of these so you can see what they are, and then if you haven't been able to get to South Africa, you will have something to work with.
