Dear Sarah:

I received your shipment which contained part of Order no. 2. (75 WHITE #3 pattern)

All the orders I have sent you are for a certain pattern which the person who *has ordered* ~~wants the order~~ wants.

I hope you still have the samples which I sent to you, showing the patterns. #1 is the large snowflake. #2 is the bell, and #3 is the star, mentioned above. What are the Tree Leave ornaments and the Round ornaments for? In one of my early letters this year I asked you if you could make me a sample of just the middle part of #1. A sample is just one made up so I could see if I liked it and if the ladies would like it. Then if we liked it I could have you make more of them. The Tree leaves ornaments look like just the patterns that extend from the center of #1. It's quite pretty, but might be too small to use as a christmas ornament. I will show it to my friends and see what they think.

There may be a problem with what I am saying not being understood. ECRU, for instance is a color. It is the color of the natural thread which your ornaments were made of last year, which you sent to me. This is a sample of ECRU or NATURAL color thread.

You can mail these in a plastic sack  
and then wrap it in brown paper and put  
string around it and put the address on.  
This might save you a little weight.

I have now received back all my canceled checks, which means you now have all the money, for which I am glad. It is nice to know I can send money more easily now. You are probably working very hard getting your things ready for the fair. Probably by now your ladies have all the christmas ornaments made. When you mail them to me check them against the color and the pattern number so as to be sure they are what I ordered.

In case you haven't still got my original patterns and the numbers, I have enclosed them again so you will know which ones I have ordered.

The circle white ones you sent, which I received this morning, does not make a very good snowflake pattern. It can be used to put under tea or punch glasses to keep water off of furniture, but I don't have much use for 73 or those.

I have cut the leaf part off the large snowflake. Have one of your ladies make me ONE sample to see how we like it. In WHITE thread. I have stitched where I cut them off so they wouldn't unravel. I am excited about the growth of the branch and glad that you have young and couple missionaries working with you again. I'm sure they love you as much as I do.
