Utah State Signs Junior College Standout

LOGAN, UT -- Utah State's head basketball coach Stew Morrill announced today the signing of John Neil to a national letter of intent to compete for the Aggies beginning in the fall of 2002. Neil, currently a sophomore

at Canada College in Redwood City, Calif., will serve an LDS mission beginning next fall.

Neil, a 6-7, 212-pound forward, averaged 27 points per game at Pinewood High School in Los Altos, Calif., and 12 points and six rebounds per game for Canada College as a freshman last season. Named to the all-Coast Conference Second Team as a freshman, Neil shot 82 percent from the free-throw line, 51 percent from the field, 41 percent from three-point range, and led his team in scoring in the final eight games of the season. Canada College has averaged 25 wins a year for the last eight seasons for Coach Mike LaGarza.

"John is an excellent skill player who can shoot, pass and handle the basketball," commented Morrill. "He comes from an outstanding junior college program, so he will be ahead of some in terms of the coaching he has received. He will be a valuable addition to our program and should be able to play both the big guard and small forward positions.

"John is a high character young man that will join us when he returns from an LDS mission. We will lose five seniors that year, so we will need him to be ready to go."

When Neil joins the Utah State basketball team in the fall of 2002, USU will have to replace the class that includes Tony Brown, Brennan Ray, Dan Stewart, Rashaun Thomas and Brad Willden.

We're getting along fine with Jeremy, our 6-9 "foreign exchange" student from San Diego who is on John's basketball team. He still hasn't learned to duck under the lamp in the hallway and he's too tall for our shower, but he seems to like it here--who wouldn't with free room and board, transportation, and a housekeeper to change your bed once a week.
