There is nothing wrong with enjoying the lovely and wonderful things that make life enjoyable and beautiful, providing we keep our perspectives in the right place. The puritan concepts sometimes made poverty look righteous--I don't believe in that. I believe that a person should live within his means, because if he doesn't his family suffers, but I believe that material things are made to make our lives more enjoyable and that money is made to help life be beautiful. And I don't mean ostentatious, however. The biggest danger of having money is that it might become our God and that is why the Lord said that it is "hard for a rich man to enter the kingdom of Heaven." The rich man forgets, sometimes where his blessings came from and thinks he did it all himself.
