6th October

I shall actually be leaving London on the 22nd October and am due to arrive in Harare at 6am on Saturday 23rd October. Anyway I understand that you will be leaving for South Africa on the day of my arrival in Harare, and I am very pleased to know that I shall be able to see you before you leave, as no doubt there will be things you want to instruct me on. My husband will be travelling back a few weeks later, as he has a few odds and ends to tie-up here before he leaves.

I do hope that everything has gone well for you both during your stay in Zimbabwe, but I guess you will now be counting the months or days till you also get back to your own home and family.

The summer here was excellent this year, but over the past two weeks there has been a rapid change to autumn weather, and it is now very cold and wet, which makes travelling about rather uncomfortable. Prices of almost every commodity are extremely high, and although there is a wide variety of foodstuffs etc., the price restricts one from purchasing anything other than the absolute essentials. Despite the need to economise due to price inflation, my weight has "inflated" by more than a few pounds, and I am looking forward to getting back to Zimbabwe where the temptation to "overeat" is curbed.
