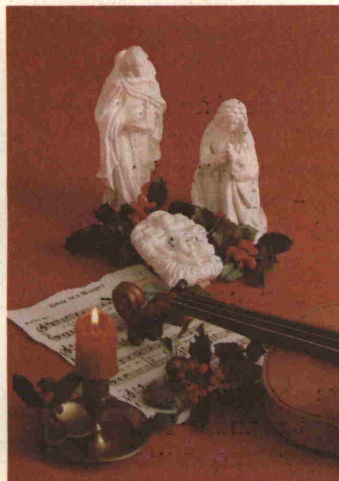


December 6, 1982
