and Sister Benington







has taken my place. I don't mind the release it gives me a little more time to myself although now that Gospel Study classes have started again I am busy preparing lessons.

What a pity you are not here to enjoy them. The cabbages too are forming heads so it won't be long before we can use them. Its hard to believe that January has already passed, where does the time go?

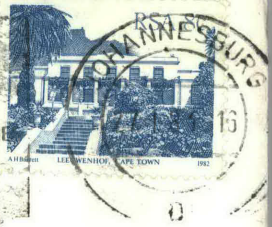
