Work is slow and discouraging here, too. I caught a bad cold as soon as we got here - missed our first Sunday - and have had a hard time getting over it - sinus and hoarseness. But we've met a lot of nice people. Members are very friendly and the spirit at Church is great. We've been contacting inactive - (about 75% of membership) people who haven't been to Church for years - Really don't know how we'll be able to do much good - They've been visited by the Mr. Brides, then the Blacks & the Wheatfills - now us - It doesn't look too promising.
