Using available ingredients thru the trial and error method, I can now make a delicious tasting and light textured cake. I've made thousands of cakes over the past 40 years, but here the first four didn't rise. There is no shortening as we know it. Everything is made with butter, so my cake decorating is at a minimal in this climate. I've had yeast sent from home and last Sunday served my good rolls. are closed Monday morning and everything except Banks close at 11:30 or 12 until 2 or 3 every afternoon when the banks close. Our trips to town are frustrating but fascinating; the beauty, the squalor, the rejuvenation, the decay, the affluence, the needy. The Moslem Mosque is in the center of a block of shops. The "temporary" doors are always ajar and we look hard as we go by. The Tamoul temples are gaudy in comparison. We attended their New Year's festival last week in a large open-air theatre, 144 kilometers around the island. The evening was beautiful with a gentle breeze, the scent of flowers, and clouds making the moon occasionally disappear. The skyline was a gentle descent to the sea - not mountainous peaks as on our side of the ocean islands. The president of the Tamoul Association and the announcer were tall handsome Indians both wearing white - pants and long shirts. The musicians were also in white. The singer chanted on and on with slight variations in his renditions. I was grateful for my preparation from the Cultural Refinement lesson in Relief Society. The dancers were beautifully costumed - sparkling pants with a fan-skirt as they moved their legs; some in sarees. Exquisite!
