NOTE B - PRIOR PERIOD ADJUSTMENT - RESTATEMENT OF INVENTORY

During the year, the parent company restated its beginning inventory to properly reflect its inventory at the lower of cost or market, by a write down of slow moving sintered diamond inventory. This resulted in a restatement in beginning retained earnings of \$257,852.

NOTE C - ACCOUNTING CHANGES - LEASES ON APRIL 1, 1982 Interest 18 on During the year, the company changed its method of accounting for leased property under capitalized leases to be in conformity with Financial Accounting Standards Board statements #13 and #17, which established new standards of accounting for capital leases. The company's retained earnings, as of May 1, 1979, has been restated by \$3,987 to give retroactive effect for the change in accounting as if statements #13 and #17 had been in effect for prior years. The change in accounting involved the capitalization of equipment obligations at discounted amounts totaling \$289,450; the amortization of the related lease assets over the lease periods which approximate the lives of the equipment; the reduction of the lease obligations by monthly lease payments, net of charges to interest expense; and the recognition of the deferred income tax effects.
