

The manifesto quieted things down
for a while but the Federal Govt
accused the church of continuing to
marry 2nd & other wives to male
members. ^{fourteen} Four years later Joseph F. Smith
issued the 2nd manifesto making the
practice subject to excommunication.
Some of the highest church leaders
were excommunicated during this time.

"Interventionism" is the intervening in
the affairs of the family by outside
institutions.

During the ^{last 14} 19th century and the
20th century there have been more and
more controls put on families by the
Government ~~and~~ both State and Federal.
It also means the invasion of ideas
which change, interfere, and cause
conflict within the home. (and within
the parents).

Child labor laws, compulsory
education, labor laws, social security,
and many others increasingly intervene
in what once was a sacred sanctuary
run by the Mother and father within
the home.

Even the right to punish a child
is controlled. Some parents correcting
a child on the street now is accused
of child abuse.

This is very general; ideas should be
placed in some historical context & supported
by specifics. C-
