 settlement) and by 1700 there were to one  
 woman indicating the beginning of  
 more equal families.  
 mortality rate was high in  
 both New England and in the South,  
 but lower in the South.  
 Not until the 19th century could  
 a couple plan on living together until  
 old age or having a reasonable number  
 of their children to adulthood.  
 Settlement grew along the coast.  
 which made steel transportation routes for  
 marketing from products, but it could
