November 19, 1989

For family home evening the kids and I carved pumpkins in preparation for Halloween. Everyone carved their own except for Willis. Hyrum was proud of his art work. Sarah and Hannah even did their own pumpkin gut work. They turned out suprisingly well.

Willis started pre-school this month. The local high school child development class sponsors the pre-school. He is in a group where he is one of the older kids. Willis turned 4 years old last Thursday. He had a small party with the boys in the neighborhood. The major activity was decorating cup cakes. Willis liked opening presents the best.

We hope and pray that my brother Willis is recovering from his illness. He has a rare virus which has affected his heart. I spoke with him on the phone today. He will probably go home from the hospital tomorrow.

My cousin Marilyn and family are coming for Thanksgiving. The children are looking forward to their visit!
