Dear Family:

I guess in a family of self-starters as far as letter writing is concerned that the new idea would work, but it doesn't with us--we're all too busy, I guess, so let's go back to the original Hall Manack. I received only one letter this month--Virginia's, so I will duplicate her's and mine and then duplicate all of them for my own records when the next time rolls around.

As there are eight in the family writing (hopefully) it should circulate at least three times a year and maybe that is enough.

Let's reiterate (if I remember them correctly) the rules:

1. The route will go like this:
    - A. Virginia to Mother and Dad
    - B. Mother to Nancy and Doug
    - C. Nancy to David and Karen
    - D. David & Karen to Tracy and Betsy
    - E. Tracy & Betsy to Liz and Marty
    - F. Liz and Marty to Charlotte and Bryan
    - G. Charlotte and Bryan to Sherlene & Dan
    - H. Sherlene & Dan to Virginia
  2. The letter will not be kept longer than a week. If you do not have your reply written within the week, send it on anyway and send everyone a chaser. (if you want) If everyone is keeping it a week the chaser will catch up the next stop so you would really have to send your chaser to the next stop.
  3. If everyone writes only two pages (no more, please) you would not have to weigh the letter, but just add the former postage plus 15 cents for your own weight. I have started this in a manila envelope.
  4. Anyone keeping the letter over one week will have to buy all of us a hot fudge sundae the next time we are all together. Remember--  
**YOU DON'T HAVE TO WRITE BUT PLEASE DON'T HANG ON TO THE HALLMANACK.**
- It should circulate every two to three months. two months of one week plus a month for circulation.

I have enclosed seven sheets. glue yours to a card and post it so you will remember the route.

I just came in from the Greenhouse. I've been  
transplanting my baby orchids ~~into~~ larger pots  
(Some of them). Growing orchids is almost as  
exciting as raising kids, but less expensive and  
they don't talk back. Just on three years ago,  
after my G.H. freeze, I bought 3 or 4 "Community  
pots". After the seedlings come out of the  
flask where they grow by hundreds, they  
put them in Community pots of 20-30.  
These were what I bought. Most (when  
I got them) had 3 or 4 leaves and were  
quite tiny. I planted them in 2 1/2" flats  
they have done quite well. Some are still in  
the flats, but most have been trans. to  
#4, 2 1/2 - 3 - 4 " pots. It's interesting to see the  
different leaf structure when the parentage  
is the same so you know the flower  
will be different. I have about 2/3  
of one side of the G.H. devoted to these  
babies (of others I have purchased)  
they're 2-5 per plant in 2-3" pots  
versus 15-30 for blooming size plants.  
It's a gamble, but in all those I  
should get enough choice ones to  
justify the time & effort.

The reason I offered to buy her

So we are not renting out from under you. Come ahead and visit us.

Dad and I have been taking a morning walk for the last month. I have lost 12 pounds since the first of the year and still need to lose 15 more pounds. I am still off hormones and still having those \*\*\*\*\* hot flashes. If anyone wants to know what the stars are for --well, they're stars, what else. If we walk around the block towards the Mission T Center, it is 1.3 if we walk down by the stadium and around it is 1.6. We have been taking the latter route, and Dad runs around the track when we reach the stadium. They have a rubberized track and it is much easier on the knees. Dad is trying to get ready for the back-packing with the Priests.

We are still being sued. Hope that the next time this comes around it will be settled, but David says it will go on for a LONG time. RATS.

Saturday the 30th of June I attended the first reunion of the high school class of 39. It was very interesting seeing those old friends that I had not seen for 40 years.
