Dear Family,

We enjoyed a stimulating Stake Conference this weekend. Paul H. Dunn was the visiting General Authority and he always keeps everyone's interest with his stories. The first thing he did when he spoke to us was ask if anyone knew the score of the BYU game. The congregation chuckled as he retorted that it was important to be a well balanced individual. (I was interested in hearing that Tracy Jr. is now a sports fan. Bryan and I listen to the BYU games on our side band every week. Now we can say we are well rounded!)

Speaking of being well rounded--that describes my condition perfectly. I had a friend comment today that I look like I'm about ready to burst and that is exactly how I feel. I've had a terrific appetite the past month and in the last two weeks I gained 6 pounds. The doctor raised his eyebrows but said he'd let me get away with it because I'm still below 135 lb.

Two months ago a new Primary Pres. was called but I was asked to remain in the presidency as her second counsilar. I was delighted because I love the Primary but because the other members of the presidency were completely unfamiliar with the program, I carried a lot of the responsibility as they learned. I came home from church each week exhausted. One Sunday while I was up in bed recovering, Bryan called the Bishop and requested that I be released. (Matt. 5:17&18) Last example in the Bible is the story of Luke there is a marvelous story of an appearance of the Savior to two disciples who were on their way to Emmaus from Jerusalem. Verse 27 says, "And beginning at Moses and all the prophets, he expounded unto them in all the scriptures the things concerning himself." Oh how I wish that I could have been there to hear his words. What did he say? Whatever He said, it caused their hearts to burn and rejoice. If I ever do write this book it will be written primarily to the church. The focus will be on "what the Old Testament said about the Messiah, how it was fulfilled, and what is yet to be fulfilled." I haven't determined how ambitious I am in this idea yet. Maybe I could get agency to write it for me.
