Alaskan Eskimos unequalled in Arctic.

a. carving, hair ornaments, belt fasteners, combs - needle cases, Stumblers, hoppers - hoppers - work bag fasteners - harpoon sockets, drag handles, harpoon refts, fish lines,

Bering Sea & Pacific Eskimos - notes for wooden bowls & containers, food bowls, ladles & spoons, knives of various shapes & sizes with neatly fitting blades.

## Clathing & weaving -

skin garments tailored with utmost skill and often tastefully inset with insets, bands, trims, & tassels. (no 82)

Kodiak Island - conical basketry hats richly ornamented

South of Bering Strait - Eskimo men wore wooden visors that projected fat in front of hunter's face.
