Notes on Books read on Brusel

1. a Haida Pattlech - 81 page - (Borrowed - but carefully)

War was waged to get the means to give Pattleches.
Pattlech is a giving away of Property. It is different from a feast.

Haida social life turned on "Pattleches"

There are 2 kinds

- * 1- Wa legal - given by chiefs members of his own clan

occasions: Hair raising & adoption of another chief's son 3) tattooing of friend's children 4) cutting of apertures for labrets 5) ear-rings, ear pendants, nose ornaments, etc.

Chief borrowed from ^{opposite} clan thru his wife & pd back through husband or wives of those he borrowed of, pattlech seems to have been an endless ^{chain} stream of property, a lot of everyone's fortune in hands of men giving Pattlech at the time.

2. The St K Pattlech was only made of raising of a grave-post (xat) for a dead chief by the man who took his place & was given by members of opp. clan who had previously attended the funeral.

Dances of the secret society, (those caused to be inspired) were indispensable accompaniments of a pattlech.
