Temperate rain-forest area - Puget
S.W. Coast. Cont yellow & red cedar.
center of Indian Culture. Tree (yellow cedar)
not found north of Sitka.

The area was also richly supplied with
fish, berries & natural & abundant native
food sources.

The Athabaskans had much contact
with the Tlingits & Haidas as they descended
the coast then on the rivers.

This interchange brought to a halt by
Tlingit when European contact. They ^{wanted} no
compet. for fur trade.

Iron tools last abt 75 yrs in wet cl
only stone implements date far back.
It is not a promise

Tlingit has a "magnificent artistic tradition" which
flourished along Puget S.W. Coast.
