**1937-1939** Attended Weber College and graduated in 1939. Worked as college janitor and also continued to play in the Hi-Hatters Dance Band.

After school studies  
Tracy, Lane, Darrell, Vern Stromberg, and a red-headed fellow...there may have been others...all studied together.  
Quit orchestra sometime around March 1938.

Got job working full time photography operation with Denton Checketts.

**1939** Getting more interested in girls but dated very little due to financial constraints.

Almost always went with others. Started going more and more with Ida-Rose Langford about July 1939.

**1939** Quit Checketts for a better job as a Jr. Chemist at Sperry Flour Mills at the foot of 30<sup>th</sup> Street in Ogden. Started school at the U of U in the fall. I commuted weekends to work at Sperry and see Ida-Rose. Almost gave up going to the U because of the long registration lines and paperwork. Looking back, this was a very close call for my future success.

Continued to work at Sperry and worked full time there in the summer of 1940.

**1941** Marriage to Ida-Rose Langford on September 24, 1941.

Continued working weekends at Sperry's and part time at the University of Utah. Ida-Rose quits work at Woolworths as it became apparent that I could earn enough for us to live and also keep up my grades in school.

Our lives were pleasant. Being married was a special blessing to me. I was a very serious person. Ida-Rose enlivened my life.
