BISHOPS WORKSHOP FOR ALL BISHOPRICS IN THE STAKE BEING HELD IN SEPTEMBER.

A Bishops workshop will be held Sept. 3, 5 thru 7, to assist all the Bishoprics in our Stake in carrying forth their many responsibilities. This should be especially helpful to the new Bishoprics recently sustained. Bishop Carl Buehner of the Presiding Bishops office will get the workshop off to a good start as kick-off speaker early Tuesday morning. Many other well qualified people have been contacted to present information on the varied needs of our Bishoprics. All Bishoprics of the Stake have been especially interested in the information to be presented toward better Church administration.

Priesthood Correlation Program-"Watch Over the Church Always"

"Watch over the Church always" is the call given to all Melchizedek and Aaronic Priesthood holders in our Stake.

Since the Lord in the Doctrine and Covenants, Section 20, gave to the priesthood of the Church the responsibility of watching over the Church and seeing that every member does his duty, it becomes the responsibility of all priesthood bearers to assume this activity as a fundamental part of their quorum responsibility.

It is contemplated that this new program will encompass all activity prescribed in the Doctrine and Covenants, Section 20, verses 38-52. This will require a minimum of at least one visit a month to the home of each family and as many more as necessary to adequately accomplish the purposes set out in that revelation.

This Priesthood Correlation program will be accomplished in each ward through the combined effort and cooperation of the ward bishop in his dual capacity of presiding high priest in the ward and president of the Aaronic Priesthood, in consultation with the leader of each Melchizedek Priesthood quorum or group living in the ward.

The objective in adopting the foregoing procedure is to so correlate the priesthood activity of the Church that through it, priesthood holders, Melchizedek and Aaronic, as specified by the Lord in the revelation cited, will be in fact, "Watch over the Church always, and be with an strengthen them; and see that there is no iniquity in the Church."

To accomplish this objective, priesthood bearers will literally become priesthood watchmen, watching over the entire membership of the Church. They must become well acquainted with each member of every family for whom they are responsible, including their individual Church responsibilities and needs, and through example, proper teaching, and follow up, bring them to a faithful observance of Gospel standards and the performance of their full duty.

STAKE MISSION PRESIDENT TELLS OF CONVERSION AS A RESULT OF MEMBERS LIVING THE GOSPEL.

This is the story of a conversion which came about because a member of our Church was a living testimony of the gospel of Jesus Christ. Kathryn Allen (Kay) who was baptized on August 13, is 23 years old and a graduate of the University of Maine. She is the oldest of six children and comes from a small town near Boston, Massachusetts. She met Margene Symons and other members of the Church last year at Merril Palmer School in Detroit, Michigan where they were roomates for a semester.

According to Kay, Margene not only lived the teachings of the gospel but spoke freely to non LDS friends regarding her religious convictions and deep faith in her own Church. This so impressed Kay that she came West this summer to investigate the Church and get better acquainted with the Symons family. She enrolled in a religion class at BYU and eventually heard the gospel message from the East Sharon Stake

Missionaries. Fortunately for Kay and for the Church too, the whole Symons family rang true. They prepared the way for a conversion which otherwise may never have taken place. The formula seems to be very simple. Live the gospel and don't be afraid to tell your non LDS friends about it.


